ANTHEM NOTE: The text of today's anthem was originally a five stanza hymn text written by Georg Neumark in 1641. Originally titled "Song of Consolation", this text was born out of difficult circumstances in the author's life and would have been very poignant in the context of the Thirty Year's War (1618-1648) of which the singers would have been painfully aware. The message of the hymn and anthem, translated in the 1850's and based on Psalm 55, is straightforward; trust in God and all will be well - He will carry us through each day with unwavering love. The anthem includes the tune originally paired with the text with added Baroque-like ornamentation.


